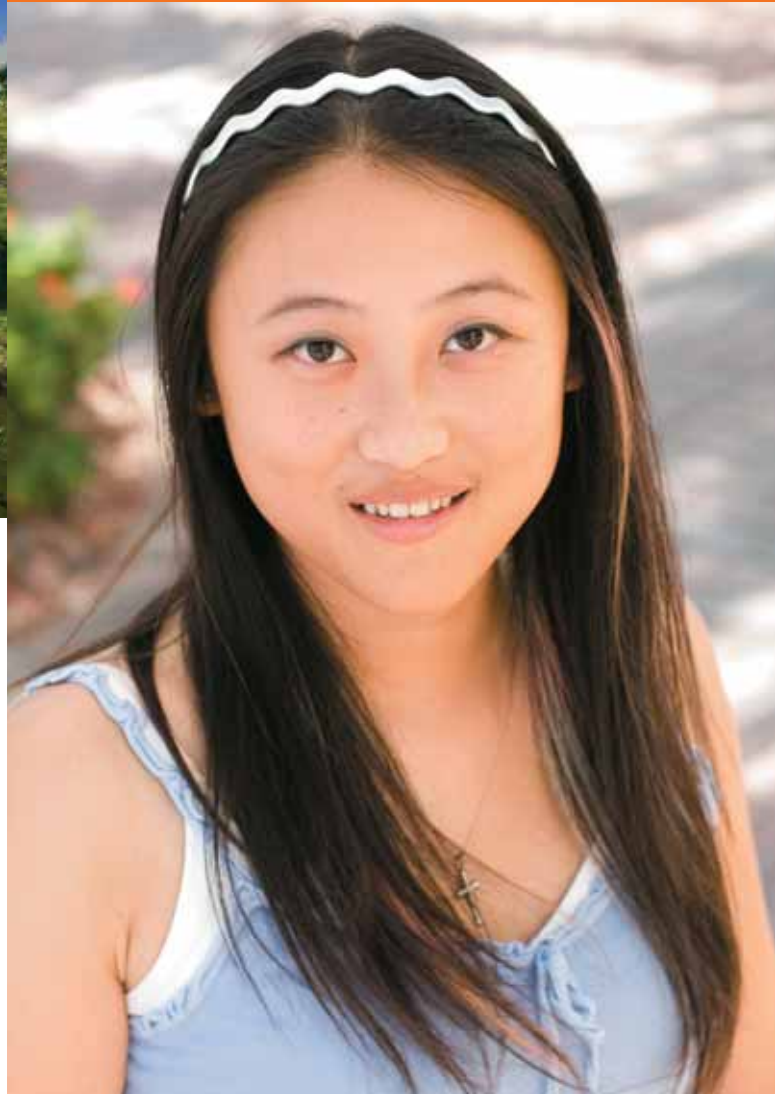

Economics Minor

Business students must take ECO 211, 212, 302** and **(3)** *three* additional Economics courses. Non-business students in any school or college may minor in Economics. Non-business students must take ECO 211, 212, 302 and **two** additional Economics courses.

All courses submitted for the major or minor must be completed with a grade of "C-" or higher and with an overall GPA of 2.0 or higher.



Economics may be the major of a candidate for the Master of Arts (*M.A.*) and Doctor of Philosophy (*Ph.D.*) degrees. Interested candidates should contact the departmental chair.

**MTH 109 or MAS 110 or a higher level Calculus course is required of all Economics majors and minors. The Calculus course must be completed before enrolling in ECO 302.
